LIMITED IN-PERSON HOURS

The library is opening the building to patrons with reduced capacity, limited hours and limited services.

Saturday: 2-5 p.m.

Sundays: Closed



HEALTH & SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

The well-being of our community and staff is always our top priority.

What we're asking you to do:

- · Wear a face covering while inside the library.
- · Maintain at least 6 feet of distance from others.
- · Follow all directional signs and floor markings.
- Keep your hands clean. Hand sanitizer will be provided throughout the library.
- Do not enter the library if you currently have or recently had a fever, cough, shortness of breath, or are feeling unwell.

What we're doing to keep you safe:

- Limiting the number of people in the library.
- · Maintaining 6 feet of distance between each other and patrons.
- · Wearing face coverings while inside the library.
- · Following CDC cleaning and disinfecting protocols

- · Computer sessions will be limited to one hour per day.
- · Grab 'n go browsing -- please don't linger and use self-check if possible.
