

New Wifi Access Points Installed Means Increased Outside Coverage and Stronger Signal

The library was able to replace its aging wifi access points inside and outside of the building thanks to a grant it received. This means more coverage in our parking lot, and a stronger, more stable signal. In the diagram, the red area shows the old range of the wifi signal; the yellow shows the new range. Our wifi is on 24/7, and no password is required for the "MPLD Patron" network.

Funding for this grant was awarded by the Illinois State Library, a Department of the Office of Secretary of State, using funds provided by the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services, under the provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.




