#### **IMPORTANT SERVICE UPDATE:**

The library resumed walk-in service February 8, but at 50% capacity. Here's what you need to know:

- Our hours will stay the same Monday, Wednesday, Friday, Saturday: 9 a.m. 5 p.m.; Tuesday, Thursday: 11 a.m. 7 p.m.; Sunday: closed
- In-building visits are limited to 30 minutes per person per day, and includes browsing, checking out holds and using our technology equipment.
- Curbside pickup of library materials is available by appointment during open hours call, chat or email to reserve a time.
- Face coverings are still required (both nose and mouth must be covered).
- Late fees will not accrue, but we can accept payment for lost/damaged items.



## **Library Board Names New Director**

The McHenry Public Library District Board of Trustees is pleased to announce the appointment of a new director. Lesley Jakacki, who has been Acting Director for the past few months following the retirement of James Scholtz, was officially appointed Executive Director at the January 19 Board meeting by a unanimous vote.

Jakacki, formerly Youth Services Manager for the Library, has been with the Library since 2004. She holds a Master's Degree in Library Science, and started at McHenry as a librarian in the Adult Services department, then moved to the Youth Services department as Teen Librarian/ Youth Services Assistant Manager, then was promoted to Youth Services Manager.

Charles Reilly, Library Board
President, said "The Library has
faced many challenges in the past
and will continue to face more in
the future. However, challenges
also give rise to opportunities.
The Board is confident that under
Lesley's leadership, and all working
together, we can utilize those
opportunities to continue to grow
and develop the Library, so that
it remains and will continue to
be a source of high standards,
satisfaction and pride for our
patrons and the entire community.'

Jakacki's goals for the coming year include focusing on changing service models due to the pandemic, building repairs, filling staff vacancies once full services are restored, and updating the Library's Long-Range Plan with the Board.

## Three Online Resources Discontinued

We had to make some difficult decisions last year. One of those was deciding to discontinue three of our online resources — *CreativeBug, Miss Humblebee's Academy* (ended January 1) and *Curiosity Stream* (ends February 28). We work to keep providing the best resources we can to our patrons.


